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The Trinity Centre Drop-in Winchester

- Around 200 new individuals every year
- Average 50 people a day during quarter 4 2007/08
- Average 20 people each day are sleeping rough
- Over 250 individuals receive health care from the Health Care Team at the drop in each year.
- Average 45 hot meals provided per day



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The Camrose Centre Drop-in Basingstoke

- New drop in opened January 2008
- Open two days per week
- Groups and 1 to 1 or outreach in afternoons
- Full range of Trinity services offered.

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The Women's Centre

- Service since April 2006
- Open three days a week
- To date over 150 clients have engaged with the service
